

BSMGC – Rules for Hole-In-One Payouts

The weekly regular tournament Hole-In-One pot is voluntarily. The Club will also pay a “regular” member who got a Hole-In-One \$100 from the treasury in addition to whatever the Hole-In-One Pot pays him. The cost to enter is \$1 per week and must be placed in the tournament envelope with the \$5 tournament entry fee (\$6 total). The following are rules pertaining to the payouts:

- 1) Each week, if there is not a Hole-In-One, the pot will carry over to the next week.
- 2) The maximum amount that will be awarded to a member who entered the Hole-In-One pot is \$1,000.
- 3) If a member does not enter the Hole-In-One Pot for that week then the Club will still pay a “regular” member \$100 for getting a Hole-In-One.
- 4) No guests are eligible. Associate members (AM) that enter the regular weekly tournament and add the \$1 to the tournament fee (\$6 total) are eligible for the HIO pot, but not the Club’s \$100 payout.
- 5) Although AMs are NOT allowed to participate in the 4 annual special tournaments (Ron Ulreich, Club Champion, Member Memorial, and President’s Cup), they may join the concurrent regular tournament and are eligible for the HIO pot if they pay the fees (\$5 and \$1).
- 6) No player is eligible for the HIO pot or Club \$100 HIO prize if they have been disqualified (DQ) or withdrawn (WD) prior to or including the hole played.
- 7) When the pot exceeds \$1000, the additional amount will be allocated 50% to the Hole-In-One pot and 50% to the Scholarship Fund.
- 8) When the pot reaches \$1,500, the additional amount will be allocated 100% to the Scholarship Fund.
- 9) If two or more players have Holes-In-One during the same tournament, they will split the pot. And, if the pot is over \$1000, they will split the entire HIO pot (up to the \$1500 maximum pot limit) and each “regular” member will receive the \$100 payout from club funds.
- 10) Away tournaments will not be included. However, alternate courses (e.g. Olivas, Sterling, River Ridge) for weekly regular Tuesday tournament play are not considered Away tournaments.

Whenever a member makes a Hole-In-One during any BSMGC weekly tournament he is responsible to report the HIO by ensuring the scorecard is marked and signed by himself and a BSMGC member witness. If he has entered the weekly tournament, he should also mark the Closest to the Pin (CTP) sheet if there is one on that hole.
